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- The HFA's Role
 - Require HFA funds recipients to conduct a Needs Assessment of residents and potential residents
 - Require dedication of % of units to homeless
 - Work with HFA funds recipients to leverage opportunities to obtain social services
 - Build in space in property for social services
 - Look at other potential sources of leverage
 - Provide linkages with known social service agencies

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- Does project need services?
 - Depends on current/proposed resident population
 - Income may be a factor
 - Even ELI residents may not need services
 - How to determine if it's not obvious
 - Needs assessment
 - Information during resident screening
 - Source of resident referral
 - Questionnaire

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- Which services?
 - No need to *provide* them
 - Some residents will have caseworkers
 - Can partner with organizations to provide services
 - Obtain information on what's available
 - Continuums of Care (CoCs)
 - Municipal social service agencies
 - Nonprofits

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- Types of services (common examples)
 - Employment services
 - Educational funds
 - “Mainstream” (SSI, TANF, Medicaid, etc.)
 - Community-based healthcare
 - Substance abuse providers
 - Mental health service providers

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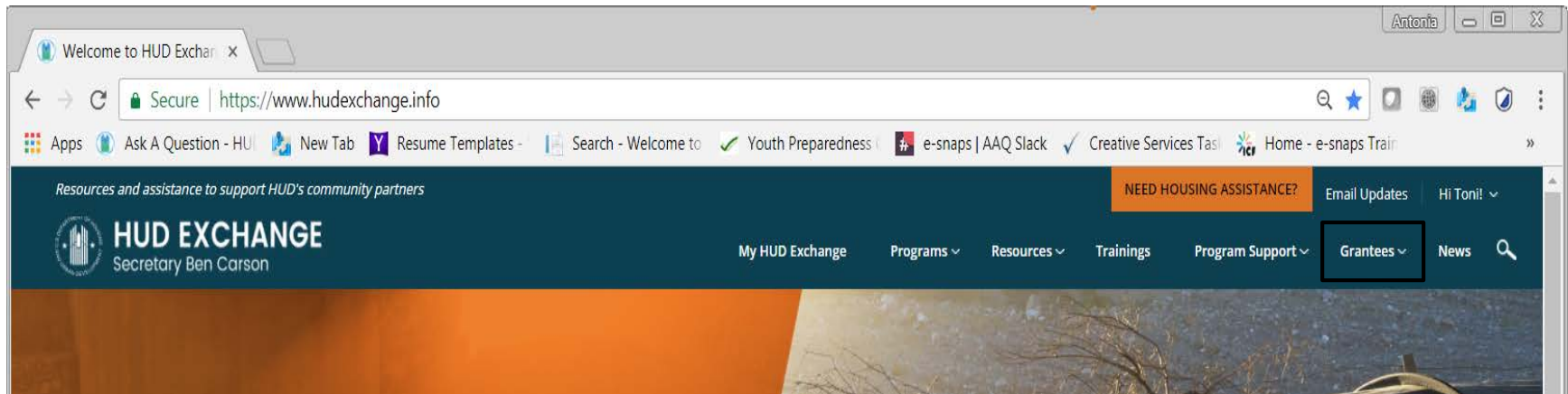
- Potential Service Providers/Programs
 - Community Action Agencies
 - Religious institutions
 - Continuums of Care (CoCs) for homeless/formerly homeless individuals/families

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- Continuums of Care (CoCs)
 - Consortia of providers of housing, supportive services, and related organizations for assisting homeless families and individuals
 - Can conduct needs assessments
 - Know what services are available in the community
 - Can offer residents opportunity to participate in Coordinated Entry system
 - Can help HTF funds recipients to connect with service providers

CoC: Continuum of Care Program

The CoC Program provides funding to states, localities, and nonprofit organizations to provide permanent housing, transitional housing, supportive services, HMIS, and, in some cases, homelessness prevention.

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
